PARCC Resources for Parents and Families

The PASS model refers to the term "parent" as any adult who plays an important role in a child's family life.

The Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers Assessment (PARCC) is New Jersey's state test. It addresses longstanding concerns that parents, educators and employers have about the level of rigor in current state assessments. Many current tests do not measure the ability of students to think critically and apply their knowledge rather than just memorize facts. The PARCC assessments expect students to answer a variety of types of questions, show their work, and explain the reasoning behind their answers.

There is a lot of information about PARCC on the Internet. PASS 4 guidance documents and partnership supports around the PARCC assessments provide resources, materials and guided opportunities to work in the best interest of the children we share. The Parent Academy for Student Success (PASS) model is an important tool for educators and parents to discuss and learn more about the PARCC assessment.
