Colleges and universities award merit scholarships to students who meet specific GPA and ACT/SAT requirements. You can learn about these requirements through the financial aid page of your college's website. The spotlight this week is on the **Presidential Scholarship at Montana State University**. It covers full tuition plus a generous stipend. Qualified applicants will have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.75 and an ACT Composite of 30.

The **Boettcher Scholarship** is a Colorado scholarship for high school seniors. It is one of the oldest and most prestigious merit-based scholarships in the state. It covers the cost of tuition, fees and books at Colorado four-year colleges and universities. Boettcher scholars also receive a living stipend. Take the senior competitiveness quiz at www.boettcherfoundation.org to see if you should apply. The deadline is October 25.

Interested in being the next greatest meteorologist? Or storm chaser? The **University of Colorado at Boulder** has added a new degree program in Atmospheric and Oceanic Studies.

The United State Senate Youth Program is for outstanding high school juniors and seniors who are interested in pursuing careers in public service. It will be held in Washington, DC from March 4-11.
