## Re: Tardy & Leaving Early Policy

## **Tardy Policy:**

The initial warning bell for school to begin is at 8:17 AM, followed by the final bell for all children to be in class at 8:20 AM. Unfortunately many of our children have been arriving at school on a regular basis after these times, and are missing the most important instructional part of the day. Therefore, Lincoln Elementary School has enacted a tardy policy with the following provisions:

- 1. All children arriving to school after 8:20 AM will be considered tardy.
- 2. Per trimester, every child will be allowed 3 unexcused tardies. Children will start with "a clean slate" each new trimester.
- 3. Children with more than 3 unexcused tardies per trimester will serve 1 day of lunch detention for each day tardy.
- 4. Excused tardies will be for medical reasons and family emergencies only and may require proof such as a doctor's note. If proof is not provided when requested, these tardies will be considered unexcused.
- 5. Parents may serve their child's detention for being tardy, provided they notify the school first.
- 6. Children with an excessive amount of tardies may be referred to the School Attendance Review Board for further action.

## **Leaving Early Policy:**

Students are expected to be on time daily and stay for the entire day. It is in violation of school rules and State law (Education 48200) if a child is tardy or leaves early without a note or phone call verifying a valid excuse. Tardy and leaving early are excused only for the same reasons as legal absences. In addition, if a student is absent for more than any 30 minute period during the school day without a valid excuse, this is also a violation of school rules and State law (Ed. Code 4820). If your child is leaving school early on a regular basis without a valid/legal reason, the school site will address the problem first, followed by issuing a referral to the district attendance office and eventually, the School Attendance Review Board for further action.
