 i_1 California Health and Safety Code Section 1799.102 says, "No person who in good faith, and not for compensation, renders emergency medical or nonmedical care at the scene of an emergency shall be liable for any civil damages resulting from any act or omission."

 i_2 Use extreme caution when approaching a downed or nonresponsive person. Look over the area to ensure there are no hazards that can cause harm to you, the victim, or others.

- i₃ National Fire Prevention Agency (NFPA)
 - Incipient Stage: Refers to the severity of a fire where the progression is in the early stage and has not developed beyond that which can be extinguished using portable fire extinguishers or hand-lines flowing up to 473 L/min (125 gmp)
 - b. Incipient Fire Fighting: Fire fighting performed inside or outside of an enclosed structure or building when the fire has not progressed beyond incipient stage.
