Student Learning - Academic Achievement

As we move through the school year, we are nearing the end of the first academic quarter.



The school is charged with preparing your children for mastering the Nevada Academic Content Standards. Here is what the teachers and children work with.

- ▶ The Nevada Academic Content Standards, are focused in part on the English language arts and mathematics standards that Nevada adopted from the Common Core Curriculum Standards in 2010.
- ▶ The Nevada Academic Content Standards focus on our students' need to become high functioning problem solvers and critical thinkers. This encourages and promotes the students using the content learned through instruction in problems that relate to real world situations.
- ▶ The Common Core and Nevada Academic Content Standards provide guidance that challenges teachers and students to prepare students for college and career readiness.
- ▶ The Smarter Balanced Testing for grades 3 8 align with the Nevada Academic Content Standards. The tests are taken on computers and include different types of questions and reading passages. The tests also have a performance portion where students are asked to take the knowledge they learn in class and use it to solve an intensive problem while justifying and explaining what they did.
- Using our Evaluate System to track student progress monthly and using Smarter Balanced practice tests will help our teachers design better instruction for the students and help the students to see what they have done correctly and what they continue to need help with in the classroom.
